

Dog Training

A well-trained dog is a happy dog and will not be a nuisance to others. Puppy socialisation classes are a great way to start training. Details of puppy classes and dog training classes are available from your local vet, libraries or the Patrol Officers.

Please remember:

- Always observe dog control orders.
- Give your dog plenty of exercise but keep him under control.
- Do not allow your dog to worry livestock
- Never leave your dog alone all day. He will get lonely and very, very bored. It is unfair to him and your neighbours if he is always barking.
- Have your dog spayed or neutered to prevent unplanned litters. Unplanned litters lead to hundreds of unwanted dogs and puppies.
- If you are buying a puppy, always see the puppy with its mother. Buy from a specialist breeder who knows and loves the breed. Or why not consider adopting a dog from a dog rescue centre?
- Teach children to respect dogs and other animals. Never leave dogs and young children together unsupervised.
- Enjoy your dog but respect the rights of others.
- Be a responsible owner.

A dog owners guide to dog-free and dog-friendly beaches in Shepway



When life's a beach (and when it's not)

The Shepway coastline with its 26 miles of sand and shingle beaches offers some great walks for dogs and their owners. But not everyone wants to share beaches with dogs all the year round. Between 1 May and 30 September dogs are banned from the certain beaches. Please check for the 'dog-free' signs and continue to keep checking – most signs are on the promenade and you might not see them from the beach itself! Nine stretches of beach have a summer beach ban – leaving plenty of other parts of the coastline for dogs and owners to enjoy.

The beaches where a dog beach ban is in place are:

Folkestone - Sunny Sands.

Folkestone - Mermaids Beach (in front of Lower Leas Coastal Park.

Sandgate/Seabrook - Sandgate Castle to Murco Garage.

Hythe - Twiss Road to St Leonard's Road.

Dymchurch - Sycamore Gardens to Martello Car Park.

St Mary's Bay - The Fairway to river outfall.


Littlestone - Water tower at Madeira Road to Clark Road.

Greatstone - Jolly Fisherman carpark through to 17 the Parade.


Greatstone - 114 the Parade through to 172 the Parade.

Bag it, tie it, bin it.

No-one should have to 'dodge the dog mess' when they are out and about in our district. Not only is it unpleasant, but dog mess can transmit the disease Toxocara Canis to humans. Although the disease is rare, it can cause disability - and children are particularly vulnerable.



You must clear up after your dog if it fouls wherever you are in the Shepway district. This control order covers most open space in the district including parks, children's play areas, sports pitches, recreation grounds, grass verges, promenades, pavements, footpaths and beaches. The penalty for

failing to clean up afterwards is £80.

Small plastic bags or nappy sacks make ideal poop scoops. Keep them where you keep your dog lead so that picking up a few bags becomes as automatic as clipping your dog on its lead before going for a walk.


To avoid smells and prevent flies, please tie the bag before depositing it in dog waste bin or litter bin. Please don't throw bags into hedges, verges or drains. Keep them until you find a bin.






St Mary's Bay



Dymchurch Beach


