A breathing space affords protections which include:  • pausing enforcement action and contact from creditors  • freezing interest and charges on debts whilst the mental health crisis lasts plus thirty days after the crisis has ended  To be eligible for a breathing space an approved mental health professional (AMHP) needs to provide evidence to a debt advisor that the individual is in receipt of mental health crisis treatment for a mental disorder which is of a serious nature. British Gas Energy Trust	If you're struggling with domestic gas and electricity debts owed to British Gas or other suppliers, you may be eligible to apply for a grant from the Trust to clear that debt. You don't have to be a British Gas customer to apply for an Individual & Families energy debt grant, but we will require a recent energy statement that shows your energy debt. We have also launched the British Gas Energy Support Fund, which is only available for British Gas customers to apply to. Please note the Trust will require information on your financial circumstances to be able to assess your application. The grant is paid directly to your energy provider.  You should get money or debt advice before applying for a grant. This will help you feel confident that you'll be able to manage your energy costs in the future and support your application.  The Trust is unable to help everyone who applies. Proof of income will be required when you apply. The full criteria and how to apply can be found on the Trust's website.
